



LETTER FROM FR. DAN

Dear Friend,

What a contrast this week's Gospel from Mark offers compared to last week's from John. Both present the call of the first disciples, and both mention John the Baptist, Peter and Andrew, but that's where the similarities end.



For me, it's not a matter of which story gives us the historical truth (i.e. what actually happened) but rather of how, taken together, these stories present a way of thinking about my own "yes" to Jesus, and how the short story and long story of discipleship actually unfold.

Last week's Gospel highlighted John the Baptist's prophetic vision, his perception of Jesus: Behold the Lamb of God. This week, we hear of John's arrest. Last week we heard about a string of directions to Jesus: John the Baptist to his disciples; Andrew going to Peter. All of it led to a "staying with" Jesus. This week, by contrast, we see Peter and Andrew dropping everything (even their father!) to follow Jesus immediately.

I recently enjoyed the gift of spending an afternoon with cousins who first welcomed me into their lives back in 1979, when I first moved to California, years before I was a friar. We caught each other up on our lives and after we said goodbye what took shape in my mind was the long-haul journey of my life that couldn't have happened without a sturdy network of love and care. I remembered, too, how crazy it felt when I discovered the Franciscans and eventually jumped in. The short story – the moment-to-moment fears, the fumbles, and the sometimes-jarring consequences of saying "yes" – all of it continues. At the same time, it does give way to a longer story of "staying with", reconnecting, and getting perspective, all of which makes it possible to set out, again and again.

Los Angeles Religious Education Congress February 15-18, 2024 (In-Person)

THIS YEAR'S THEME: BE LOVED!

The Los Angeles Religious Education Congress is the largest annual gathering of its kind in the world. Held at the Anaheim Convention Center, it is sponsored by the Office of Religious Education for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, and includes people of all ministries, vocations and faiths. It opens on Thursday, February 15 with Youth Day – a gathering of high school aged young people that features keynote speakers, workshops and a liturgy planned by young people, for young people.

Adult Days (Friday, February 16 to Sunday, February 18) include hundreds of workshops in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese. Participants also receive access to arena keynotes, the opening ceremony, a variety of liturgies, entertainment, evening events, and the Exhibit Hall, which showcases religious art, music and publishing houses.

RECONFIGURATION OF CHURCH TABERNACLE



In partnership with Old Mission staff and with important assistance from Father Joe Schwab, the space behind the main altar in the Mission Church has been reopened for a tabernacle.

The new tabernacle space was crafted by parishioner (and master carpenter) Dave Schiefen, along with Jim Balsitis (Director of Facilities), in collaboration with Father Henri (with his expertise in architectural design), and Maria Cabrera (finishing touches!). The space will provide access to the tabernacle both from the front and from the sacristy side of the reredos. This location will enhance the area of the front pews as a space for prayer and devotion, while the Portiuncula Chapel near the front doors of the church continues as an adoration chapel.



MISSION CHURCH MOBILITY RAMP

In collaboration with Old Mission Santa Barbara, the parish has received approval from the Santa Barbara Historic Landmark Commission on an initial conceptual rendering of a mobility access ramp to the front of the Mission church. The decision of the Commission represents a major step forward on an issue of church access and hospitality that has been under discussion (and partially addressed in various ways) for over 30 years. The next steps in the Commission's process require a geological review of the proposed space and final design approval prior to the issuance of building permits and initial construction.

BECOMING A LAUDATO SI' PARISH

ELIAS CHACOUR: BLESSED IS THE PEACEMAKER

PFather Elias Chacour describes himself as a "Palestinian-Arab-Christian-Israeli." To that seemingly contradictory identity you can add even more complexity: Chacour served as Archbishop of Akko, Haifa, Nazareth and All Galilee in the Melkite Greek Catholic Church from 2006 to 2014. The Melkites are in full communion with Rome but celebrate the Byzantine rite. His church traces its origins to the earliest years of Christianity and its roots to the land walked by Jesus. Chacour grew up near the Mount of Beatitudes, where it is believed Iesus delivered his famous sermon.

Born in 1939, Chacour attended minor seminary in Haifa but for his ecclesiastical degree journeyed to the famed Seminary of Saint Sulpice in Paris. He later became the first Arab to earn a graduate degree at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, studying Bible, Talmud, Aramaic, and Syriac. He speaks eleven languages. His memoir Blood Brothers has been translated into more than twenty languages and its sequel We Belong to the Land into eleven. The former Archbishop of Galilee has been nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize three times and received many other awards, including five honorary doctorates from such universities as Duke and Emory. We'll explore why in future columns.

Guidelines for online interaction with young people


