



LETTER FROM FR. DAN

Dear Friend,

Two mourning doves in the Sacred Garden this morning. The first bird sounds of the day and thank goodness they're not the complaining crows! Two very mellow voices - a mother bird and her little



one, I'd like to think. Easter starting softly and early...

I've been listening to the sounds of poems, too, this morning, from a collection called "Leaving the Base Camp at Dawn". Like the bird sounds, the book's title prompted me right away from the Lenten path to the threshold of Easter, to the promise of the mountaintop Isaiah sings about where a banquet will be spread, the veil will be lifted, and every tear wiped away. The Easter promise is a prophetic, hopecharged vista.

Turns out that in this book the journey to that mountaintop really is the destination, as each poem along the way is a musical arrival. In one brilliantly entitled "For Water Thou Art, and Unto Water..." the poet/pilgrim comes to the water's edge – East Beach? – and moves tentatively into the waves. Eventually he's "swayed/pulled/trash-talked/ toppled/into/ the diving in/the passing over/the irresistible/next/ forever."

Those last four words echo the bird call and I savor them. In front of me is the oceanic power greater than myself of which Christ Jesus is the icon. I move toward him daily and toward his irresistible offer of the way, the truth, and life eternal – the ocean's constant sign – always both a "now" and a "next." It's our baptism into love made present. From the garden to the water and back again to the tree of life, where we harvest the fruit of hope and offer the next forevers to the world. Rejoice! Happy Easter!



HE IS RISEN CELEBRATE THE RESURRECTION

"In the liturgy we relive the state of mind of the disciples over the news which the women had brought: Jesus is Risen! We have seen him! If only we were so luminous! But this is not just cosmetic! It comes from within, from a heart immersed in the source of this joy, like that of Mary Magdalene, who wept over the loss of her Lord and could hardly believe her eyes seeing him risen. Whoever experiences this becomes a witness of the Resurrection, for in a certain sense he himself has risen, she herself has risen. He or she is then capable of carrying a "ray" of light of the Risen One into various situations: to those that are happy, making them more beautiful by preserving them from egoism; to those that are painful, bringing serenity and hope."

BECOMING A LAUDATO SI' PARISH

POPE FRANCIS ON SAINT FRANCIS

In Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home, the Pope proclaims admiration for his namesake. "Saint Francis is the example par excellence of care for the vulnerable and of an integral ecology lived out joyfully and authentically." Integral ecology yokes care for Creation with care for the poor, who contribute the least to climate change but suffer from it the most.

Creation deserves respect for itself and not only for its usefulness. "The poverty and austerity of Saint Francis were no mere veneer of asceticism, but something much more radical: a refusal to turn reality into an object simply to be used and controlled."

Prayer has been described as a 'long, loving look at the real.' The Pope sees that perspective in "Saint Francis [who]...invites us to see nature as a magnificent book in which God speaks to us and grants us a glimpse of his infinite beauty and goodness."

Climate change is an urgent challenge, but we are the problem, not nature. As Saint Francis understood, "Rather than a problem to be solved, the world is a joyful mystery to be contemplated with gladness and praise." That Franciscan insight is the beginning of the solution to climate change.

KEEPING OUR CHILDREN SAFE

Abuse may be hiding behind positive behavioral changes

Last week, we looked at negative behavioral changes that could be red flags for abuse. It is important for caregivers to remember that some seemingly positive changes could also be signs of abuse, such as when a child tries to "be perfect" so as to avoid a feared consequence or in some way "control" circumstances so as to avoid or minimize further exposure to a traumatic situation.
