

## LETTER FROM FR. DAN

Dear Friend,

As I write this, I realize that I still haven't adjusted to the time change. The great "spring forward" just makes me want to "fall back" several times a day. Not as easy to adjust as it once was... and somehow appropriate that all this stumbling is triggered during Lent.



And another adjustment of sorts this week: St. Patrick's Day gives way to the Day of the Lord, as it falls on the 5th Sunday of Lent. Put this one down not to legislative decree but to another source of (sometimes) mysterious guidance: our liturgical calendar.

So, from several directions this week I am reminded that I (and even the Irish – around and within me...) are not always in charge. *Adjust and move on, sayeth the Lord.*

Speaking of which, last week I heard a suggestion for a change for Ash Wednesday next year. Not the date, but the wording for the distribution of ashes. How about instead of "Remember that you are dust..." or "Repent and believe..." a simple: Get over yourself. Would that be an exciting way to begin our Lenten journey? It's certainly a refreshing take on what it means to "follow," which happens to be this week's guidepost word for our Lenten journey. *Get over yourself and follow, sayeth the Lord?*

Turns out that what we will hear in this week's Gospel is very much along these lines. It's a speech by Jesus worded by John the Evangelist, though, and he tends to be, in this case anyway, if not more subtle, at least more parabolic: "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a single grain of wheat, but if it dies, it produces much fruit." That's the love we follow...yes, gulp, I'll adjust and move on!

The Good Friday collection is a response to this situation and, as I said above, help is needed now more than ever. On behalf of my fellow friars and those they serve in the Holy Land, I thank you in advance for your generosity.

## BECOMING A LAUDATO SI' PARISH

### **THE COMMON GOOD AND HUMAN RIGHTS**

The two social encyclicals of Pope John XXIII illuminate key ideas of Catholic Social Teaching. “Mater et Magistra: Christianity and Social Progress” (1961) defines the common good as “the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily.”

John’s second encyclical, “Pacem in Terris” (1963), observes that “in our time the common good is chiefly guaranteed when personal rights and duties are maintained.” Furthermore, “to safeguard the inviolable rights of the human person, and to facilitate the fulfillment of his duties, should be the chief duty of every public authority.” The fundamental purpose of government is to defend and promote the common good, and thereby the equal dignity and rights of all.

The U.S. Bill of Rights spells out civil and political rights. What distinguishes the Catholic approach is the enumeration also of social and economic rights: for example, not only the right to freedom of speech but also the right to just wages. That puts the Church in concert with the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, as adopted by the United Nations in 1948, which John lauded in “Pacem in Terris.” Peace results when rights are respected.

The National Child Traumatic Stress Network (NCTSN) defines a traumatic event as a “frightening, dangerous, or violent event that poses a threat to a child’s life or bodily integrity.” This includes events that victimize the children directly or events of this type that children witness, particularly when the person harmed is a loved one. A child’s understanding of safety depends on the safety of his caregivers.
