## LETTER FROM PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,  
Several months ago I taped a poem to the wall over the desk where I sit each morning. The words of the poem seem to take on new meaning, depending on what life is presenting me at the moment. Today that would be this moment when we begin a new year as a parish family, on the feast of the Holy Family.



The first words of the poem are a simple summons to begin: *Let's go*. But then the hero of the poem, a dog, proceeds along a path that's anything but clean and clear. Maybe that's us, like the Holy Family, starting along a course that will likely include some some rocks and mud. Not to worry. I think St. Francis would approve of the idea that we might learn something from a dog about how to proceed (*dance?*) and from a poet about how to spot beauty along a muddled way. Here's the poem:

### Overland to the Islands

Let's go – much as that dog goes,  
intently haphazard. The  
Mexican light on a day that  
'smells like autumn in Connecticut'  
makes iris ripples on his  
black gleaming fur – and that too  
is as one would desire – a radiance  
consorting with the dance.

Under his feet  
rocks and mud, his imagination, sniffing,  
engaged in its perceptions – dancing  
edgeways, there's nothing  
the dog disdains on his way,  
nevertheless he  
keeps moving, changing  
pace and approach but  
not direction – 'every step an arrival.'

## Keeping our Children Safe

### ALWAYS KEEP YOUR BLIND SPOTS IN MIND

Each week, more than 50 children are killed or injured when a driver backs up the car. In an overwhelming number of those cases, a parent, relative, or close friend is behind the wheel. It's devastating to think that a simple action could cause such harm to your child, but it happens far too frequently. Be aware of your 'blind spots' when you're behind the wheel — those areas you know are there, but can't see clearly from your mirrors. Check out what's happening around your vehicle before you get in. Make sure you know where your children are before you start your car
