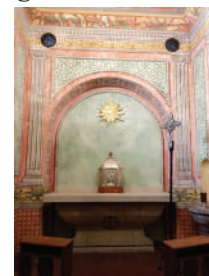

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friend,

My heart is still singing as I recall the sight of 117 people filling the Bonaventure Room last Saturday morning. My heart was moved as Father Joe spoke to us with great erudition and compassion about our need to allow one another and ourselves, the “grace of being human.” In the Gospel of Luke this Sunday, we see the consequences of a community rejecting that very grace at work in the person of Jesus. Being open to that grace – the grace that allows real relationship to happen – requires us to see with fresh eyes.



Over the last year the beauty of the Mission and our work as a parish has come through our partnering with others. We haven't stood alone on our hill. Healing, service, reconciliation, and celebration have happened through our relationships with individuals and communities from all over the city and beyond.

This week we officially begin our 2019 “Together in Mission” campaign, our effort with the Archdiocese of Los Angeles to bring help to communities in need. Our cooperation with “Together in Mission” last year helped support our neighbors at Notre Dame School and the campus faith community at St. Mark's at UCSB. The generosity of the parish was so huge that we exceeded our goal by \$5000. That amount was returned to us and was a big help in getting our financial statement in the black as 2018 came to a close.

Offering each other the grace of being human means being together on a mission. When we step back and look at it, we don't see moral perfection. What we see are the dark and light of Van Gogh's “The Starry Night” – swirls of color at odd angles and curves (our textured lives!) all forming, together, something beautiful to behold!

CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

FROM SOCIAL JUSTICE TO JUST WAR AND JUST PEACE

Over the last six months, this column introduced Church teaching on social justice. In January we concluded with a 5-part quiz. If you've completed the quiz, please send me your results. A prize will be awarded to the parishioner with the best score (and the earliest submission).

Now we begin to explore what the Church has to say about war and peace. There is no definitive encyclical on the topic. John XXIII's *Pacem in Terris* (1963) is about the foundation of peace to be built on respect for universal human rights. *Gaudium et Spes: The Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World* (Vatican Council II, 1965) condemns indiscriminate bombing of cities, but like *Pacem in Terris*, stops short of a presentation on the just war tradition as developed by such theological luminaries as Saints Augustine and Thomas Aquinas. *The Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church* (2004) offers a mere one-sentence outline of the conditions necessary for war to be justified.

The fullest examination so far has been offered by the U.S. Bishops in their pastoral letter of 1983, *The Challenge of Peace*. We'll explore all this, from the Old Testament to Pope Francis, in coming bulletins.

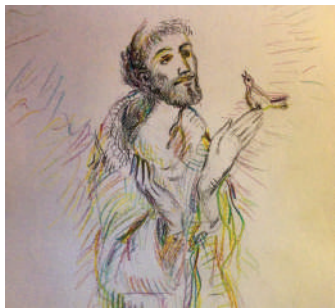
